

COVID-19 JOB SITE SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

1. All contractors shall complete the Summit County [Physical Distancing Protocol](#) to identify jobsite safety measure being utilized.
2. Proper hand hygiene and sanitation measures must be readily available to all employees, and vendors and frequently utilized by all employees and vendors. These measures shall be in the form of hand washing sinks or hand sanitizer stations (sanitizer to contain >60% alcohol).
3. Contractors and Property owners, including their agents, lessees, and subcontractors, are required to ensure that all workers have access to face coverings, are instructed to wear face coverings during the performance of all work, and are instructed to maintain social distancing of at least 6 feet, whenever possible, on all their Construction Sites.
4. [Environmental cleaning guidelines](#) from the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) must be followed (e.g., clean and disinfect high touch surfaces.)
5. Social distancing recommendations must be met, include limiting contact of people within 6 feet from each other for 15 minutes or longer, and any other applicable social distancing requirements that are promulgated. No more than 10 persons shall be gathered on the jobsite (work area) at any time.
6. Employees experiencing COVID-19 symptoms must be told not to come to work. Symptoms of COVID-19 include, fever (>100.4°F) or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea, vomiting or diarrhea. *This list does not include all possible symptoms. CDC will continue to update this list as we learn more about COVID-19.*

If an employee has any of these symptoms, they will be directed to get [tested](#) for COVID-19 infection, call their medical provider if experiencing severe illness and isolate for at least 10 days from when symptoms started or at least 24 hours after fever resolves (without fever reducing medicine) and other symptoms are improving. 7. Employees who have had close contact with a person who has recently had COVID-19 must not come to work for 14 days since their last day of exposure.
8. Older adults and individuals with underlying medical conditions that are at increased risk of serious COVID-19 must be encouraged not to be on the jobsite.

9. Have all relevant work complete prior to scheduling inspections.
10. There shall be a single point of contact on-site and communication on site will be by phone or carried out with a minimum six feet separation at all times with inspector.
11. Contractors and subs shall not be staged in the inspection areas.
12. Minimize the need for contact with surfaces on job sites.
13. Contractors, if possible, shall cluster multiple inspections to ensure fewer visits on site. For instance, building, mechanical, electrical, plumbing inspections should be scheduled the same day.
14. Final inspections shall all be scheduled on the same day.
15. A contact phone # shall be provided when scheduling inspections. The inspector will call 15 minutes ahead of time to notify the contractor they will arrive shortly. The G.C. shall then clear the inspection area of all employees who are not essential for the inspection.
16. **If the Building inspector determines that the requirements of this Job Site Safety plan are not being followed, the inspection shall be terminated and a re-inspect fee will be levied.**
